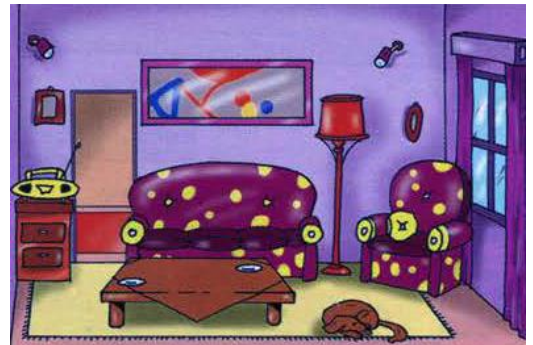
Chapter four. Larry and Lulu's House

Best of all Larry and Lulu like the magician. He shows funny **tricks** with his chimp Cherry.

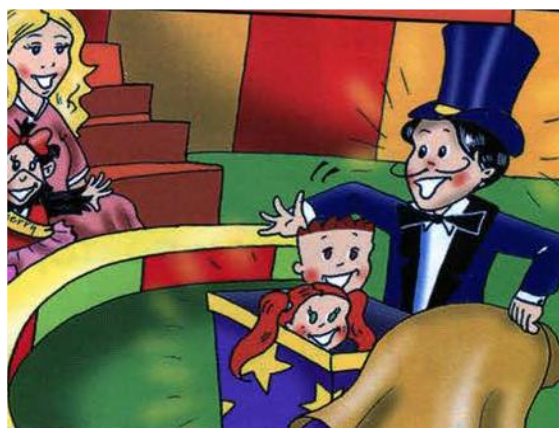
“Now, boys and girls! Look at Cherry,” says the magician.

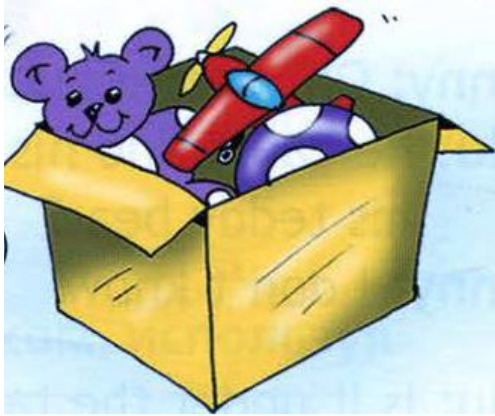

"**What about** the toy box?" asks Nanny, "Is it in the toy box?"

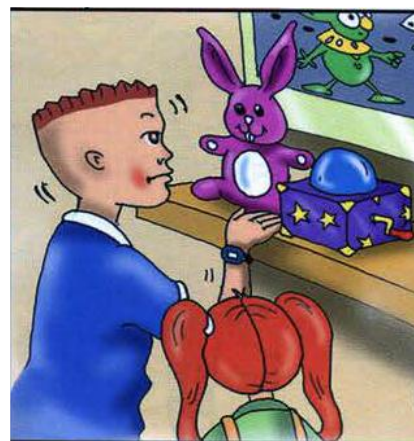
Larry and Lulu go to the toy box and find their toys there.

Is it your teddy bear?” asks Larry.

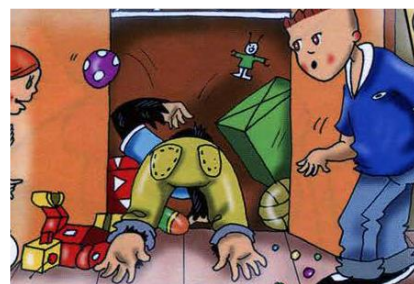
“Oh, **clever** Chuckles!” praises him Lulu.
